

Bank Of America Create Art Award 2010 Call for Submissions

The Bank of America CREATE Art Award is the largest participatory art award in the UK. This annual award helps artists living or working within the London 2012 host boroughs to deliver brand new public art commissions as part of the CREATE Arts Festival. The award aims to open up exciting opportunities for artists to work with their neighbours: the residents of the London 2012 host boroughs. In turn, it gives local people a chance to engage with major art projects happening in their neighbourhoods.

We are now inviting submissions for a participatory art project from artists who live or work in one of the five host boroughs. Integral to the award is the active participation of people who live in each of the five boroughs. The final piece can be permanent or temporary and we welcome proposals from artists working in all media.

Deadline for submissions: 5pm, 2 September 2009

- The commission will be made in October 2009
- The work must culminate in July 2010 as part of CREATE10
- The total value of the commission is £40,000

Guidence Notes

Eligibility

- The award is open to all artists who are not currently in education and who live or work in one of the five host boroughs of Greenwich, Hackney, Newham, Tower Hamlets and Waltham Forest.
- We will consider individual artists or collective applications.
- The work must involve the participation of residents from each of the five host boroughs
- The final work must take place within the five host boroughs in July 2010 as part of CREATE10.
- The proposal can be a self-contained part of a wider project. However any additional funds must be secured at the time of application.
- The award is open to artists working across all disciplines (film, art, design, interaction, design, architecture, literature, fashion, performance)

Entry

Submissions must include

- A concept pitch of no longer than 500 words
- A CV
- Visual or digital examples of previous work. Please send up to 5 images on a CD or a DVD no longer than 10 minutes in length.
- Shortlisted artists will be asked to submit a project plan and budget prior to final judging

Selection

Shortlisted applicants will be asked to prepare a five minute presentation to the panel in September 2009.

We are not able to acknowledge receipt of applications. For the return of application material, please include a stamped address envelope. We cannot accept any responsibility for loss or damage to application materials.

Deadline

The deadline for proposals is 2 September 2009

Shortlisted Applicants will be notified in September 2009. Decisions are final and no correspondence or discussion over the selection can be entered into. The commission will be awarded in October 2009.
