UNEARTHED is a new project by Neville Gabie, the Olympic Delivery Authority's (ODA) Artist in Residence on the Olympic Park.

UNEARTHED is an exhibition and archive which seeks to reveal the cultural history of the Carpenters Road artists' studios in the former Yardley's perfume factory, which used to be on the site of the London 2012 Aquatics Centre. These studios were managed by Acme and home to 500 artists between 1985 and 2001.

A collaboration between InSite Arts, Acme Studios, archaeologist James Dixon, and many of the artists, **UNEARTHED** is hosted by Ardmore Construction at Warton House, Yardley's former offices in Stratford High Street.
