Business Case:	The Project comprises a video art work to be projected onto a wall which is curved on plan and approximately 12m wide by 3.21 m high. Hardware and software is by others. The Project should include engagement with the school's Pupils. The background to the projection is a 'dot matrix' map of the world.

Background

Yate International Academy was established in September 2009, formerly King Edmund Community School. Its curriculum is based upon the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme, and it prides itself on its international theme and outlook.

Willmott Dixon Construction secured a Design and Build Contract for the redevelopment of the school in 2009 – 2010 with construction starting in 2010 and handover of the new buildings due for July 2012 with occupation in September 2012.

A key element of the new buildings' design, by Aedas Architects working for Willmott Dixon Ltd, is the 'Hub' (sometimes called 'Drum'), a substantial 'feature' internal curved wall at the school's entrance which envelops the school's reception, library and hall / drama studio.

The Hub Wall also serves as a screen for projection of an image / art_work. Three projectors will use blending hardware and software to project an image over a (curved in plan) area of approximately 12m x 3.21m. The wall is matt white and also has a 'dot matrix' map of the world which will comprise self-adhesive light-grey vinyl dots, applied by others.

We wish to commission a digital art work, which may comprise still or animated images, to welcome pupils, staff and visitors to the school and encapsulate its identity.

The work:

- Needs 'wow' factor given its prominence to the school's entrance
- Needs to convey internationalism of school at forefront of building
- Could include international dimension with art and photography
- Captures location of Academy in local and international context
- o Is informative
- Could be a facility for pupils to show their art too
- Could reference to the school's science specialism or other factors linking the school to the wider context.
- o May incorporate the school's logo
- Can link with LCD projectors around the school
- Imposes the school's identity onto VLE (Virtual Learning Environment)

The artist should work with the school and the pupils to identify what is important to them and what they want to convey to visitors.
